CARI and partner's activities at UNCCD COP17

CARI is participating in the 17th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification (UNCCD), taking place August 17–28, 2026, in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia.

Some partner organizations of the GTD, RADD0, ReSaD, and Drynet, will also be in attendance.

Together, CARI and its partners will represent the voice of civil society in international negotiations on sustainable land management in drylands.

Participation in COP17 is centered on several objectives:

- Highlight the findings of the 6th edition of Désertif'actions on the resilience of territories to drought
 - Highlight local governments in both the North and the South as key actors in sustainable land management within their territories, and encourage their involvement in discussions at international meetings
 - Raise awareness about the importance of supporting pastoralists' mobility to enhance the resilience of pastoral communities
- Engage in dialogue with GMV stakeholders to ensure that civil society is better integrated into these implementation processes

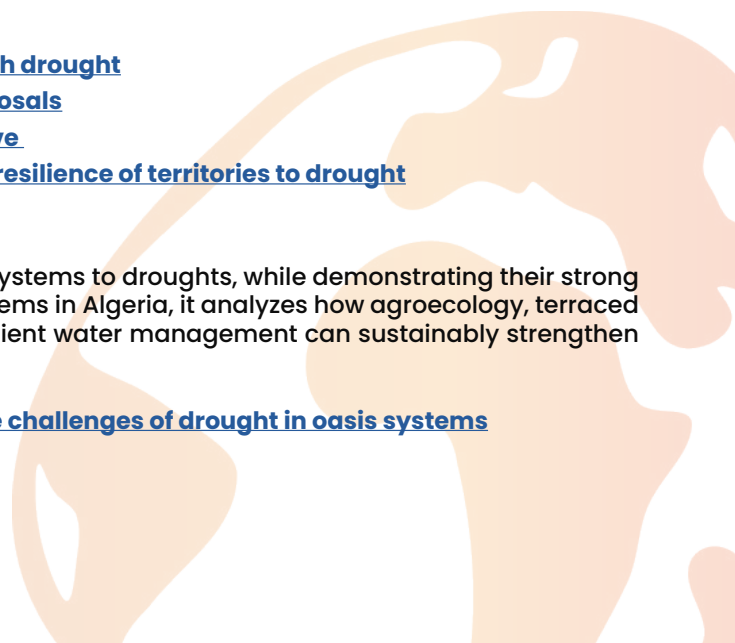
